AGE DIVISION RULES

This tournament is a no-tap tournament. All adults must get 9 pins or more on their first ball to get credit for a strike. Youth bowlers must get the following on their first ball to get a strike: Division 1 & 2-9 pins = X Division 3 & 4-8 pins or more = X.

The junior bowlers age as of 8/31/2014 will determine what division they will bowl in. Any full time high school or college student who is age 18 thru 21 and a USBC member in good standing can bowl division 1. 22 and over must bowl as an adult. 18 thru 21 and not a full time student must bowl as an adult.

There will be a maximum of 27 teams per squad on a first come basis.

Qualifying Rules & Squad Times

Sunday – August 31st (3 Squads) 1PM 3 PM 5PM

Monday – September 1st (2 Squads) 9AM 11 AM

Each team shall consist of one adult and one junior. A bowler may bowl as often as they like with the same or different partners. A junior can only advance to the semi-finals with one partner and it must be with the partner they had their advancing score with. If two or more juniors qualify to advance with the same adult then the tournament committee will assign a substitute adult bowler for them to bowl with. If there is a tie in the above situation, then the score bowled first would be the highest score. Every effort would be made in assigning substitutes of equal caliber to teams needing substitutes. If a parent qualifies with their own child and one or more other teams, then that parent has the option of choosing to bowl with their child regardless of the highest score posted.

AGE DIVISION RULES - continued

After the qualifying (11 AM Monday – final squad) the top 6 teams in each division will advance to the semi –finals. In case of a tie for 6th place there will be a one game roll-off. No pins will carry over into the semi-finals.

SEMI-FINALS

The semi-finals will be bowled immediately after the 11 AM squad Monday. This should be approximately 1 PM. Each team in the semi-finals will bowl 3 games of no tap. With the exception of Division 4 (Ages 6 – 8) they will only bowl 2 games of no-tap. (We find due to their age 3 more games makes for a long day.) The same format shall be used as in the qualifying round. The top 3 teams after 3 games (total pins) will then advance to the final round. (Division 4 Ages 6 – 8 will be after 2 games bowled.)

FINALS

The finals will be bowled immediately after the semi-final round (approximately 2:30 PM). The second and third place teams from the semi-final round will bowl a one game no tap match. The loser of that match will get third place. The winner will then bowl one game no-tap against the top seed from the semi-finals. The winner will be crowned champion with the loser taking second place. The finals should conclude around 3:30 PM.

EXPLANATION OF SCHOLARSHIP FUND

In December of 1993 we established the "Chris Wall Memorial Scholarship Fund." We have built a fund that will perpetually supply scholarship monies each year for this annual tournament. By doing this it has enabled us to keep the entry fee low and affordable with only a portion of your entry fee going toward the fund. All scholarships will be paid directly to the college or university the bowler attends. Only the actual amount won will be forwarded. 100% of the fund is used for scholarships.

A NOTE ABOUT CHRIS

As time continues on and each year we gather to bowl this event, sometimes it can be easy to forget what this tournament means to us at RebeLanes. We are a family owned and operated business and have been for many years. Each year we gather to remember and celebrate one of our family members. This tournament is celebrated in his name Chris Wall.

Although Chris passed away in 1993, for over 20 years bowlers have been granted scholarship monies in his name. Many have received these scholarships and never got to meet Chris. For those of you that never met him and for those of you that knew him, I want to take this space just to write a few words about Chris. Maybe in some way we can each remember him or get to know him.

Chris loved all sports and spent all of his life involved in them in some way. He played all the team sports growing up including football, basketball, and baseball. As he got older he enjoyed golfing and playing tennis with his father Herb Wall. Chris even got good enough to accumulate some trophies in golf and tennis. However, being the son of bowling proprietors Herb and Glenda Wall it only became natural that he be a bowler. He was a bowler and he loved it. Bowling became the love of his life.

Chris loved the game and he loved to compete. He loved bowling SSJBA events. He loved the friendships and travel that came with bowling SSJBA. In 1993, before his accident, Chris won the All-Events Scratch Title in the Mississippi State Tournament and he won our first Adult-Youth Scholarship Tournament. These titles were important to Chris, but not as important as what he represented on the lanes and in life.

Chris was a very loving and courteous young man. When you met Chris, he left an impression upon you. You always remembered his manners and how he represented himself in life. Chris was a true sportsman in every sense of the word. He was a gentleman both in and out of competition.

When bowling this weekend take a few moments and think about Chris. Conduct yourselves in ways that honor yourselves and your families. We want to thank all of you for spending your Labor Day with us and we hope all your travels are safe. Thank you.
